Modest clothes for bed (bathrooms/shower house are located in a separate building)

Modest Swimsuit (MUST BE APPROPRIATE FOR A CHURCH CAMP)

Beach Towel

Bath Towel

Closed-toed athletic shoes with traction (a must have for walking/hiking/ropes courses)

Raincoat

Flip-flops

Personal Toiletries

Toothbrush

Toothpaste

Floss

Deodorant

Shampoo

Bodywash/Soap

Sunscreen

Insect Repellant

Non-Clothing Items

Bible and Rosary

Sleeping Bag + Pillow

Flashlight

Small backpack (for water bottle, journal, pen, etc.)

Please indicate any doctor prescribed medications on Registration (**MUST** be in original container labeled with name, dosage, etc. and turned in to camp nurse at check-in)

Money for Camp Store (to buy snacks, drinks, t-shirts, etc.) – we suggest around \$60 but the final decision is yours

Camp is a space dedicated to nurturing connections with God, friends, and the great outdoors. It's essential for all visitors to respect this atmosphere by refraining from bringing items that could pose distractions or unacceptable risks. If uncertain, please inquire before bringing such items. The following list outlines items not permitted at Camp Yamhill, as they may be confiscated. In severe cases, bringing these items could

result in a camper being sent home. Our priority is ensuring everyone has a safe and enjoyable experience at Higher Calling Ropes Camp and Camp Yamhill.

What NOT to Bring To Camp:

Electronics of any kind

Cell Phone (there is no cell service or Wi-Fi available at Camp Yamhill)

Fireworks

Lighters/Matches

Weapons including pocket knives

Cigarettes, alcohol, tobacco, non-prescription drugs, illegal drugs

Inappropriate or revealing clothing (including graphics and text on T's)

Valuables or large amounts of money (Money brought to camp for the purpose of being used at the camp store must be deposited into your camp account during check-in. Any leftover money will be returned to you on the last day of camp.)

For the safety of all campers, it's important to understand the reasoning behind our rules. Imagine if each camper stored \$60 in their cabin; collectively, this would total around \$10,000 left unattended—a significant risk. To mitigate this, we ask campers to deposit their money into a camp account upon arrival. This ensures access to funds during the week while keeping them secure in a locked safe off-site. Similarly, bringing phones and earbuds to camp and leaving them unattended in cabins presents a similar risk. To safeguard your belongings, we strongly advise against bringing such items.
